PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Mike Thralls, Executive Director, led the group in the Pledge of Allegiance.

MINUTES OF PREVIOUS MEETING

A motion was made by Mr. Jett and seconded by Mr. Stunkard to approve the minutes of the November 5, 2012, Commission meeting as written. Those voting aye were: Jett, Rooker, Stunkard, and Lowrance. Nay votes: none. Motion carried.

CONSERVATION PARTNERSHIP REPORTS (Mr. Lowrance moved this report up on the agenda to accommodate Mr. Pope's schedule)

Oklahoma Association of Conservation Districts: Clay Pope, Executive Director, stated the Area Meetings were completed and very successful. He expressed appreciation to the Commission and the Natural Resources Conservation Service for their assistance with the meetings.

Mr. Pope reported that the Dust Bowl outreach events held in Woodward, Altus, Guymon, Stillwater, Oklahoma City and Tulsa were very successful and in all reached around 2000 people. The PBS premiere of the film had very high ratings in Oklahoma. He stated that the film has generated interest from other partners on educational components for the public, schools and conservation districts. Mr. Pope stated that the OACD had an interactive booth during the recent Oklahoma Farm Bureau convention. He reported on coordinating with the National Fish and Wildlife Foundation regarding the lesser prairie chicken.

A farm bill is still awaiting consideration in Congress. Mr. Pope reported on meeting with Oklahoma's Secretary of Agriculture Jim Reese and ag groups to discuss a state legislative drought package and the need for additional state operating funds for districts tied to farm bill delivery.

Mr. Stunkard expressed his congratulations to Mr. Pope, Mr. Thralls and OACD Area 4 Director Dean Graumann on their interview with the OETA. Mr. Pope stated that a series of news stories was filmed and will be developed into a 30 minute documentary.

DISTRICT DIRECTOR RESIGNATIONS AND APPOINTMENTS

Mr. Thralls presented recommendations for appointment of conservation district directors as listed in Exhibit #1. A motion was made by Mr. Stunkard and seconded by Mr. Rooker to approve district director appointments as listed with terms to expire as indicated. Those voting aye were: Jett, Rooker, Stunkard, and Lowrance. Nay votes: none. Motion carried.

CLAIMS/FINANCIAL STATEMENT

Steve Coffman, Financial Management and Human Resources Director, presented the claims and financial statement as listed in Exhibit #2. A motion was made by Mr. Stunkard and seconded by Mr. Rooker to approve the claims and financial statement. Those voting aye were: Jett, Rooker, Stunkard, and Lowrance. Nay votes: none. Motion carried.

CONSERVATION COMMISSION EMPLOYEE RECOGNITION

Wes Shockley, Water Quality Monitoring Specialist, was recognized for 20 years of service to the agency and Johnny Pelley, Watershed Technician, was recognized for 25 years of service to the agency.

Dianne Ireton, AML Administrative Officer, was recognized as the Stan Barnard Award recipient by the National Association of AML Programs. This award was presented to her at the Association's Annual Meeting.

OUT OF STATE TRAVEL REQUESTS

Mr. Thralls presented travel requests for approval as listed in Exhibit #3. He recommended approval of the request listed as (a). A motion was made by Mr. Stunkard and seconded by Mr. Rooker to approve the request as listed. Those voting aye were: Jett, Rooker, Stunkard, and Lowrance. Nay votes: none. Motion carried.

Mr. Thralls recommended ratification of the requests listed as (b) and (c) as these went through the ratification process with the Mr. Lowrance. A motion was made by Mr. Jett and seconded by Mr. Rooker to ratify the requests as listed. Those voting aye were: Jett, Rooker, Stunkard, and Lowrance. Nay votes: none. Motion carried.

2013 NO-TILL OKLAHOMA CONFERENCE

Mr. Thralls stated that the 2013 No-Till Oklahoma Conference will be held on February 19-20, 2013 in Norman, Oklahoma and recommended that the Commission co-sponsor the event. A motion was made by Mr. Stunkard and seconded by Mr. Rooker to co-sponsor the conference. Those voting aye were: Jett, Rooker, Stunkard, and Lowrance. Nay votes: none. Motion carried.

ADDITIONAL ALLOCATIONS TO DISTRICTS

Mr. Thralls is pleased to recommend approval of an additional operations allocation in the amount of \$1,000 per district because of additional farm bill delivery assistance funds received from the USDA- Natural Resources Conservation Service.

A motion was made by Mr. Stunkard and seconded by Mr. Jett to approve an additional \$1,000 per district for operations. Those voting aye were: Jett, Rooker, Stunkard, and Lowrance. Nay votes: none. Motion carried.

COST-PROGRAM - PROGRAM YEAR 14 SPECIAL REQUEST

Robert Toole, Conservation Programs Director, stated that the Seminole County Conservation District has requested to add Submergible Pumps as a component of Pumping Plant (533) practice and he recommended approval. A motion was made by Mr. Stunkard and seconded by Mr. Rooker to approve the request. Those voting aye were: Jett, Rooker, Stunkard, and Lowrance. Nay votes: none. Motion carried.

CONSERVATION PARTNERSHIP REPORTS

USDA-Natural Resources Conservation Service: Ron Hilliard, State Conservationist, stated that the Oklahoma NRCS received its budget on Friday and stated it was \$2 million short but that

watershed funds have not been added for technical assistance.

Mr. Hilliard reported that NRCS Chief Dave White retired effective December 3 and that Jason Weller has been named acting chief. He also reported that Peter Meyer, former chief, passed away last week.

Mr. Hilliard provided the following personnel update; Brent Reavis has been named Resource Specialist in the McAlester technical office. A nationwide advertisement has been made for two assistants for field operations; one to replace Lanny Miller who retired and one for Gilbert Guerero who has been named Assistant State Conservationist (Outreach/Civil Rights). Also, six soil technician positions will be advertised across the state.

Department of Agriculture, Food and Forestry: Blayne Arthur, Associate Commissioner, stated that the air conditioning chillers in the building are being replaced and the third floor is being renovated. Ms. Arthur stated the agency is undergoing IT migration.

Ms. Arthur reported that the Stillwater FFA has set up a Christmas display on the lawns of the Agriculture Building.

The agency had the opportunity to make a presentation to the Oklahoma Center for the Advancement of Science and Technology. She also reported that the National Reigning Association horse show was held this past weekend with a horse from Italy being named champion.

Ms. Arthur then reported working with Journal Communications to do an agriculture magazine for the state. It will be published at no cost to the tax payers with all funds coming from advertisers. It will be an annual publication with the hopes of becoming a quarterly publication in the future.

OKLAHOMA CONSERVATION COMMISSION MEMBERS

Mr. Rooker thanked everyone for their prayers, cards and phone calls following his recent accident and hospitalization.

Mr. Jett attended the Area 1 meeting as well as the Dust Bowl event.

Mr. Stunkard stated that he liked having the November meeting in Stillwater with the demonstrations. He also appreciated attending the Dust Bowl events in Stillwater and Tulsa. Mr. Stunkard attended the Area 3 meeting in Vinita and commended staff and the Craig County Conservation District for a good meeting.

Mr. Lowrance attended the Area 4 meeting in Chickasha and stated it was a good meeting. He had the opportunity to attend several Dust Bowl screenings and enjoyed them all. He met with the film's writer and producer Dayton Duncan at the Tulsa event.

OKLAHOMA CONSERVATION COMMISSION STAFF

Administration - Executive Director: Mr. Thralls congratulated the OACD on the success of the Area Meetings and appreciated the work of Greg Scott on the rainfall simulator

demonstrations at the meetings. Mr. Thralls also expressed appreciation for the work done on the Dust Bowl events and commended Mr. Lucas, Ms. Blaney, and Mr. Pollard for their efforts with these events.

Mr. Thralls and Mr. Pope will be meeting with the American Farmers and Ranchers Policy Committee.

District Services Division: Lisa Knauf Owen, Director, stated that a written report was included in the meeting packet and she then yielded for questions.

Water Quality Program: Shanon Phillips, Director, stated that a written report was included in the meeting packet. She then reported on the annual Blue Thumb Volunteer Conference held in November stating its success. Ms. Phillips announced the retirement of Ann Craven, water quality secretary, and stated she will be missed.

Abandoned Mine Land Reclamation Program: Mike Kastl, Director, reported on the one active site in the 2010 Grant. He also reported on the Bacon project which is the only active surface mine project at this time. Mr. Kastl stated an emergency was declared in Latimer County and AML Inspector Henry Roye is visiting the site today. Mr. Kastl updated the Commission on the Northeastern Oklahoma State University project stating he rejected the lowest bidder due to lack of expertise and equipment. The second lowest bidder, W&W Excavating, has been awarded the contract in the amount of \$1.8 million.

Financial Management and Human Resources Division: Mr. Coffman stated that the Commission, working with the Office of Management and Enterprise Services, is able to offer an alternative procedure for the Electronic Fund Transfer system for cost-share participants. A copy of a cancelled check or deposit slip for transfer of funds can be provided instead of the online registration process.

Office of Geographic Information and Technical Services: Mike Sharp, Director, stated the Commission will begin the IT consolidation process. A draft of the High-Level Plan developed by the Office of Management and Enterprise Services is the next step to be considered. Staff is working to see how support will be provided to districts for their IT needs. Mr. Sharp reported that since the majority of the Commission's IT equipment has been purchased with federal funds OMES has determined it will remain the property of the Commission.

Conservation Programs Division: Robert Toole, Director, reported that four contracts have been signed in the Kingfisher Flood Initiative Group 1 with offers accepted to relocate. Staff will begin working on Group 2 of the initiative which includes 41 additional landowners.

Administration - Assistant Director: Mr. Pollard was pleased with the success of the Area Meetings as well as the rainfall simulator sessions held outdoors. He was particularly pleased with the Dust Bowl outreach events that were held across the state. He thanked NRCS Public Information Officer Tom Lucas, the Commission's public information office Mark Harrison and OACD employee Sarah Blaney for their work with these events.



The Creation of American Indian Heritage Month: Did you Know

What started at the turn of the century as an effort to gain a day of recognition for the significant contributions the first Americans made to the establishment and growth of the U.S. has resulted in a whole month being designated for that purpose.

The first American Indian Day in a state was declared on the second Saturday in May 1916 by the governor of N.Y. Several states celebrate the fourth Friday in September. In Illinois, for example, legislators enacted such a day in 1919. Presently, several states have designated Columbus Day as Native American Day, but it continues to be a day we observe without any recognition as a national legal holiday. In 1990 President George H. W. Bush approved a joint resolution designating November 1990 "National American Indian Heritage Month." Similar proclamations have been issued each year since 1994.



CANADIAN COUNTY - El Reno Field Service Center

On October 24, East Canadian County Conservation District (ECCCD) and Canadian County NRCS teamed up with the State and Federal wildlife services to remove and relocate prairie dogs from a flood control site spillway within Canadian County to the Washita Wildlife refuge in Butler, Oklahoma. The prairie dogs had not yet reached the back toe of the dam, but were quickly approaching it and needed to be removed. ECCCD District Manager, Erica Armstrong, contacted ODWC Biologist, Larry Wiemers, who made a site visit and provided several recommendations and options. Armstrong then contacted Amber Zimmerman, Manager of the Washita National Wildlife Refuge, who expressed an interest in relocating the prairie dogs to the refuge. With that, Armstrong and Zimmerman made a plan to relocate all the prairie dogs to their wildlife refuge in Butler, Oklahoma.

Staff from the Washita National Wildlife refuge as well as the Wichita Mountain National Wildlife refuge banded together to help foam out the prairie dogs from their homes. The two teams, along with Wiemers, Armstrong and NRCS field staff worked from 10 AM to 7 PM to capture 58 prairie dogs from the site. The process was interesting as Wildlife Biologists used fire trucks with foaming nozzles to pump foam into the holes, forcing the prairie dogs out where they could be captured by hand and put into cages.

After the capture they were transported to the Washita Wildlife Refuge in Butler, OK and released on Friday, October 26th, 2012. Armstrong attended the release and reported back that all 58 dogs where alive and made it to their new homes. Our efforts were a success and we are happy to report that they're doing well in their new environment. Another example of working with our partners in conservation to preserve our Natural Resources.



The NRCS recruiting cadre achieved tremendous recruitment success for the Agency at the 34^t annual American Indian Science and Engineering Society (AISES) conference. The AISES conference was held in Anchorage, Alaska on November 1 through November 3, 2012. This year's conference theme was Adaptability. NRCS participated as a Lapis sponsor for the conference. Robert Jones, Alaska State Conservationist and NRCS cadre members, received the NRCS recognition award for the Agency at the AISES Gemstone Reception. NRCS was also recognized and honored for their sponsorship during the conference Opening Ceremonies, Closing Ceremonies and Honor Banquet. This conference attracted over 2,918 attendees, college students from 173 Tribal Colleges and Universities from across the Nation and 116 high school students. 
